16.1	Strengths of the University	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● The sponsoring trust, Charotar Arogya Mandal, has experience of more than four decades in the field of Education, Health care, Research and Public health.● The University is situated in the lush green campus in the rural area of Anand district in Gujarat.● Eminent, experienced and active members on the statutory Boards and Councils of the University● Qualified and experienced teaching faculty members● Appropriate governance structure in each constituent college and teaching hospital.● The Bhaikaka University manages Shree Krishna Hospital (SKH) and Medical Research Center which is a 1000+ bedded, NABH accredited, multi-specialty parent hospital including super-specialty centers in the same campus where medical and paramedical students of constituent institutes receive clinical training. This is the only tertiary care hospital having basic and super-specialty services catering to not only Anand district but also surrounding districts.● The superspeciality centres include a Cancer Centre, Cardiac Centre, Critical Care Centre and Bone Marrow Transplant Centre providing comprehensive care to patients.● Shree Krishna Hospital (SKH) has been designated as “District Covid-19 Hospital” by the Government of Gujarat since March 2020. This is the only district hospital having tertiary care facilities and has treated more than 9000+ patients not only from Anand district but also from other parts of the state.● Because of exemplary services of the Shree Krishna Hospital in the area of health care, the hospital has received local, regional and National level awards from the Government and Non-Government Organizations in the recent past.● Community extension is one of our key initiatives to ensure that the quality medical care can be made
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		<p>accessible to the last person in the last village.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● The extension department runs 4 peripheral centres to cater the health care facilities to the interior parts of the district and surrounding districts. ● SPARSH programme is an innovative programme which is being implemented in 150 villages of Anand, Kheda and Panchmahal Districts for diagnosing and treating Non communicable diseases in the community. SPARSH designed to create systems and processes that enable the last person in the villages it operates in to access appropriate Health Care facilities through the help of the faculties and the students. ● The Pramukhswami Medical College is the Nodal centre of National Medical Commission for training of faculty members of identified colleges from four different states, in the area of medical education technology and was awrded as the best performing centre by NMC in the past. ● Research has been given importnace since the initial years of existence of the sponsoring trust. Even undergraduate students are given opportunity to do research. ● Because of availabilty of appropriate infrastructure and clinical material in the form of patients, diagnostic and treatment facilities, wide exposure to community health and encouragement & support for research to faculty and staff members, students of all courses get rich experience in their respective programme.

The university shall have to develop other programme in the allied fields for expansion and development in the future. ● Mobilizing financial resources to meet with the necessary expenses of the university seems to be another challenge, as fees for most of our professional courses are regulated by the state level fee regulatory committee.
